The plaque and shadowbox were dedicated to honor the 100-plus Gamma Iota Sigs who financially contributed to the restoration of the HOSW and the initial operation of the Sigma Chi Zeta Colony. Without their contributions, Gamma Iota Chapter would not have been able to regain the charter and be a fully functioning chapter of Sigma Chi Fraternity.

GAMMA IOTA LEADS THE WAY

CHAPTER SEES MASSIVE PHILANTHROPY SUCCESS IN 2022

n spring 2022, Gamma Iota Chapter of Sigma Chi continued to demonstrate excellence on LSU's campus. We extended 15 bids during spring recruitment, all of which were accepted (100% acceptance rate), making ours the largest IFC spring pledge class on campus. We hosted our first-ever initiation of a new class on March 10-11. With the help of our alumni, it ran flawlessly to the benefit of all new members involved.

Brother Michael Zibilich, father of deceased Brother Keller Zibilich '13, gave a speech on mental health awareness to the entire Greek community on February 23. This event was attended by more than 1000 students from every fraternity and sorority on LSU's campus.

In March, we hosted Grand Consul **Tim Sanderson** and Grand Trustee Representative **Rick Lewandowski** for a visit to celebrate the 100th birthday of Brother **George H. Jones '42**. Regional Support Coordinator **Don McKinney** also visited the chapter in March, and after meeting with our executive board, concluded that Gamma Iota is a shining example of how the colonization process can work.

In April, we hosted our second annual Steve Carter Memorial Derby Days, which was a weeklong philanthropy event to raise money for the Huntsman Cancer Institute. In 2021, Derby Days lasted one weekend, involved 100 participants from five chapters, and raised \$5,000. This year, Derby Days was an entire week, involved over 600 participants from all 12 sorority chapters on campus, and raised over \$62,000 for the Huntsman Cancer Institute. We raised 900% more money in 2022 than we did in 2021 and had a 500% growth in participation. As of April 27, Gamma Iota Chapter is among the top 10 Sigma Chi chapters in money raised for the Huntsman Cancer Institute. This year, we raised more money than any other fraternity on campus, and we fundraised more than almost every sorority. Only one other fraternity raised over \$20,000 (Kappa Sig with \$30,000), and we doubled that number. The success of our Derby Days represents our hard work and efficient internal systems, and our large reputation and impact on LSU's campus.
